The Synod on Synodality – Communion, Participation and Mission, opened in Rome on



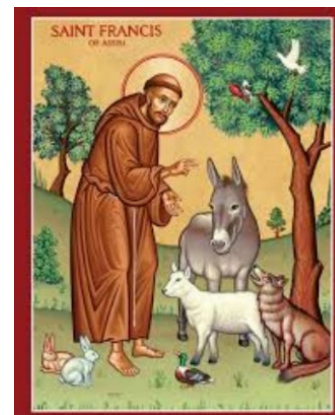
Wednesday, October 4th, representing the next stage in the process of listening and discerning what God wants from us His People in the world of today. The Synod (“walking together”) in Rome is the most important church “event” in our lifetime, with immense potential for how we are serve and proclaim the Gospel today and into the future. It is important, therefore, that we accompany the Synod in our prayer and also in being aware of what is taking place and who is saying what. Pope Francis challenges us, he asks, “Are we prepared for the adventure of this journey? Or are we fearful of the unknown, preferring to take refuge in the usual excuses: “It’s useless” or “We’ve always done it this way”? Celebrating Synod means walking on the same road, walking together”.

Prayer for the Synod

We stand before You, Holy Spirit, as we gather together in Your name.

With You alone to guide us, make Yourself at home in our hearts;

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.

Eight years after the publication of Laudato Si', Pope Francis' prophetic voice on the serious environmental problem returns. More than a social problem, for Francis it is an issue that profoundly touches human identity in its relationships, as well as the concrete survival of humanity in this world; an issue that concerns not a distant future, but a present in which we are concretely suffering the consequences of a crisis. **Laudate Deum, the new apostolic exhortation**, is rather short (only 73 paragraphs) and has a pragmatic-pastoral character, without getting lost in lofty reflections, but touching concretely on reality.

Weekly Taizé at Newman University Church, St Steph's Green, Dublin 2 each Tuesday, at 6pm. Taizé Prayer is named for the ecumenical Christian community formed in Taizé, France. The Taizé community includes brothers from all Christian denominations, including Protestant, Catholic, and Orthodox traditions. The church is dimly lit and our Taizé cross is brought out as a focal point for prayer. There is meditative song, silence, readings, and prayer. During the procession of light each person brings up their lit candle to the cross to pray. If you can't make it into town you can always tune in on our YouTube channel.
